

# IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY

## Regulatory Plan for Fiscal Year 2019 July 1, 2018

Executive Order Number Nine requires each state agency to submit an annual Regulatory Plan detailing foreseeable rulemaking initiatives for the upcoming fiscal year that the agency reasonably expects to issue in proposed or final form. The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy is in the process of completing the mandatory five-year rolling review of administrative rules and contemplates the following revisions:

### **Regulatory Action:**

**Legislative Action:** The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy's administrative rules generally do not require updates and changes throughout a fiscal year. However, the Agency does act quickly to make changes required as a result of legislative action.

### **Administrative Action:**

The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy is committed to updating the administrative rules to reflect changes in the law enforcement and academic community. The Law Enforcement Academy anticipates making the following changes to the rules in the future:

1. The Academy anticipates revisions to 501-3.5 and 501-3.6 to update the curriculums of both the long and short courses.
2. The Academy anticipates revisions to chapter 501-7 to make any revisions necessitated by changes in the law.
3. The Academy anticipates revisions to 501-8.1 to add the already existing requirements for mandatory in-service training for 'mandatory reporting'.
4. The Academy anticipates revisions to 501-2.2(3) and 501-2.2(4) to update the language and requirements for POST and MMPI test administration.
5. The Academy anticipates general, non-substantive changes to update the rules to better reflect modern terminology.
